



Report: GLCD Faculty Training

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On Wednesday, May 12, 2021, the Gender Lensed Curricula for Development (GLCD) team offered training on ways in which 14 modules that compose the curriculum may be adopted or adapted for use in on-going or new courses. They used Module 1 (Gender Lens in International Development) to share the options that instructors have for using the modules.

Twenty-five faculty and professionals participated in this 1-hour event. The objectives were as follows: share how instructors can access materials, show how to use GLCD modules in courses, present best practices for teaching content, and present best practices to facilitate conversations with students about the roles of women in development abroad and in the United States.

Drs. Piña and Murphrey provided an overview of the important context that this curriculum addresses--bringing about awareness of the challenges faced and impacts made by women, primarily in developing countries. It was emphasized that the principles shared in the curriculum can be applicable to women and other marginalized populations worldwide.

Finally, participants were provided a tour of both the instructor-facilitated and online versions of Module 1. Participant feedback was valuable and will likely result in additional seminars that will allow faculty to experience each module as a student, increasing their familiarity with the content and instilling confidence in teaching these topics.
